Enrichment Activities:

- Mary anointed Jesus with costly perfume to show how much she loved God! Talk with your child about ways to "love the Lord your God with all your heart" (Deut. 6:5).
- Help your child write a letter or postcard to someone. Then take a short trip to the post office, have him/her place the proper postage stamp and place in an outgoing mailbox to send out.
- Turn your house into a "community" with the various rooms or sections of the room being a different store/place of work. For example, your kitchen could be a grocery store and your child could use a basket to carry the items he/she will "buy". Use play money to pay for the groceries. You can set up a veterinarian's office on a table, using stuffed animals, cotton balls, bandages, empty medicine bottles, clipboard, paper, and pen. Set up a bank, using a desk, play money, pen, old checks, envelopes, etc. Have fun play-acting the jobs together!
- Ask your child what they would like to be when they grow up and have a conversation about community helpers.
- Thank God for all the community helpers, especially those that work to keep us safe!
