

## Home Enrichment Activities:

- Go outside with your child at night and gaze up at the stars. Have your child point out the brightest star that they see. Make believe it is the Star of Bethlehem. Pretend to be the wise men following the star to Jesus.
- If you don't have a Christmas wreath, make one with your child out of a paper plate, green paint or tissue paper. You can also make a natural wreath by collecting and gluing items such as twigs, cinnamon sticks, pine branches, etc.
- Talk with your child about the poinsettia plant. Go for a walk in the neighborhood to find them on porches, sidewalks, decks, or balconies as decorations for Christmas. In Mexico and Guatemala, the poinsettia is known as "La Flor de la Nochebuena" (Flower of the Holy Night or Christmas Eve).
